

## Intelligence: The effective tool for Kinetic and Non Kinetic action to curb criminal enterprise

Leader: Otisi Ukiwe, Director, Government and Corporate Affairs - SF Protective Services

In Nigeria, intelligence is not highly rated as part of the process required to aid in the fight against criminal enterprise. Although that thought process is changing as more private security companies are creating departments to cater specifically to gathering information, collating data and analysing incidents which are coterminous

to operating in the country and in extension, other parts of Africa. The need further expanded following the change in threats within country which ranges from armed attacks to civil unrest and the "unprecedented" COVID-19 which grounded operations making it difficult for businesses to recover or continue.

Intelligence is also a tool for risk management as seen in its usage by private security companies and government security forces for journey management. Intelligence gathering is therefore a standard

commencement process to prepare movement from point A to Point B. This has enabled organisations and government manage the risks surrounding the transportation of personnel and asset nationwide.

## "The Oil Theft Endemic - A challenge that is crippling the industry and economy"

Leader: Kayode Boladale, GM Operations Integrity - Oando

In the first four months of 2022 data from the Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited showed that Nigeria was losing about 250,000 barrels per day of crude oil to theft. This did not only bring the total loss to about \$1.5 billion but has become the possible biggest threat to national development and the environment.

The oil and gas sector as we know remains Nigeria's basic revenue earner. While the sector accounts for about nine per cent of Gross Domestic Product, it contributes about 65 per cent of the nation's revenue and about 90 per cent of Nigeria's foreign exchange earnings.

The endemic is quite frankly crippling the industry, resulting in shut down of operations and causing the industry to be at its lowest breaking point.

## **Session 5 - Open Forum**

#### "Banditry - The associated conflict"

Banditry as we know is a serious crime that poses a security challenge to democratic governance and peaceful coexistence in Nigeria. Bandits often terrorise communities in the North West region. Their activities include kidnapping, arson, shooting, rape, cattle rustling, killing, and looting.

Some of the factors that have led to the rise and persistence of banditry in Nigeria are under-governed spaces, a weak security apparatus, the proliferation of small arms and light weapons, socioeconomic conditions such as poverty and unemployment, cattle rustling, and illegal mining activities in the Northwest.

The Petroleum Industry Act 2021 (PIA) took several years to come into place as a major legislative overhaul.

#### It's objectives include:

- To bring legislation to reflect modern times A lot has changed since the Petroleum Act of 1969 and The Petroleum Profit Tax Act of 1959
- PIA to close gaps in modernisation
- Addresses current stabilization concerns and issues of deindustrialization
- The creation of a system with proper governance Chapter 4
- Focus on moving away from entitlement and to create economic opportunities, industrialization alongside a competitive investor friendly fiscal regime
- Redevelopment of the Niger Delta
- Introduction of new additional funds for prosperity: i.e.
  - Midstream and Downstream Intervention Fund
  - -Environmental Fund
